Requirements for Admission into the College of Education at WSU

- **WSU Admission**
- **60 credits**
- **GPA of 2.75 or higher for the last 30 credits**
- **Grades**
 - "B" or better in an English class
 - "B" or better in a Speech class
 - "C" or better in a Math class
- **Early Clinical Form**
 - 15 hours of early childhood experience (e.g. Apple Lane, faith- or community-based children's programs, summer camps, 4H, etc.)

- \$20 Application fee
 - (RCTC & Riverland \$20 is waived)
- All official college transcript(s)
